MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT By and Between Herkimer County

And

Civil Service Employees Association Inc., Local 1000, AFSCME, AFL-CIO

WHEREAS, the County of Herkimer (County) and Civil Service Employees Association Inc., Local 1000, (CSEA) are signatories to a Collective Bargaining Agreement for the term January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto wish to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement providing for a Voluntary Separation Incentive for full-time members of the CSEA bargaining unit, limited to only those members who are employed at Herkimer County Community College (College),

NOW, AS A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Full-time members of the bargaining unit represented by the CSEA who are employed at Herkimer County Community College shall be eligible for a Voluntary Separation Incentive of a one-time monetary payment of \$7,500.00.
- 2. The incentive will be payable to eligible employees who either resign or retire from the College. Employees who resign shall not be eligible for any post-retirement benefits. Employees who retire from the College within the meaning of the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall be eligible for all of the rights, privileges and benefits to which a retiree is entitled to under the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the County and CSEA.
- 3. In order to be eligible for the Voluntary Separation Incentive, the employee must notify the College no later than July 1, 2016 of the employee's intent to either resign or retire and the effective date of such resignation or retirement as described below. The employee will have until July 15, 2016 to retract their notice whereafter it will become irrevocable under the following terms of this Agreement.
 - i. Eligible employees may elect to retire or resign effective August 31, 2016 with the agreement of the College contingent on the operational needs of the College.
 - ii. Eligible employees who do not elect to retire or resign from the College in August may retire or resign on December 31, 2016.
- 4. The Voluntary Separation Incentive payment shall be made no later than (thirty) 30 days from separation from the College or no later than February 1, 2017 for those employees with a separation date of December 31, 2016.

- 5. Eligible employees who resign or retire pursuant to this agreement shall not be allowed to obtain employment at Herkimer County Community College or at Herkimer County until at least thirty (30) days after their retirement or resignation, which shall result in the employee being treated as a new hire with no credit for accumulated credits or benefits.
 - 6. All other provisions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement shall remain unchanged.
- 7. The parties agree that the terms of this Agreement are without precedent and shall not constitute a past practice.
- 8. This Memorandum of Agreement shall be subject to approval by the Herkimer County Legislature.
