A LOCAL LAW INCREASING THE SALARIES OF SOME ELECTED COUNTY OFFICERS AND COUNTY OFFICERS APPOINTED FOR A FIXED TERM DURING THEIR TERM OF OFFICE

BE IT ENACTED by the Herkimer County Legislature of the County of Herkimer as follows:

- Section 1. The base annual salary of the County Sheriff shall be the sum of Seventh Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Three Dollars (\$70,233).
- Section 2. The base annual salary of the County Administrator shall be the sum of One Hundred Two Thousand Seventy-Four Dollars (\$102,074).
- Section 3. The base annual salary of the Budget Officer and Purchasing Agent shall be the sum of Sixty Thousand Six Hundred Fifty-One Dollars (\$60,651).
- Section 4. The base annual salary of the County Attorney shall be the sum of One Hundred Thirty Six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-One Dollars (\$136,681).
- Section 5. The base annual salary of the Commissioner of Social Services shall be the sum of Eighty Four Thousand Forty-Nine Dollars (\$84,049).
- Section 6. The base annual salary of the Director of Real Property Tax Services shall be the sum of Fifty Two Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-Nine Dollars (\$52,359).
