**MINUTES
Herkimer County Legislature
First Quarter – Second Day
Wednesday, January 28, 2015
7:30 p.m.**

The Regular Session of the Herkimer County Legislature was called to order by Chairman Vincent Bono at 7:30 p. m.

Chairman Bono called on Louis Christie, Commissioner of Elections, to lead the Legislature in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Bono called for a moment of silence in recognition of all veterans, past and present.
