NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Herkimer County Legislature will hold a Public Hearing on the proposed modifications of Herkimer County Agricultural Districts # 2 and #3. The Public Hearing will be held on April 22, 2015 at 7:15 p.m. in the Herkimer County Legislature Chambers in Herkimer, New York.

Seven landowners have submitted requests in 2015 for inclusion of predominantly viable agricultural land within a certified agricultural district, and these requests have been filed with the Herkimer County Legislature pursuant to Section 303-b of the NYS Agriculture and Markets Law. Six landowners have parcels located in the Towns of Frankfort, Litchfield and Winfield which are part of or adjacent to Agricultural District No 2; one landowner has parcels located in the Towns of Little Falls and German Flatts, which are part of or adjacent to Agricultural No. 3.

The public hearing shall be held to consider these landowners' requests and the recommendations of the Herkimer County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board.
