## MINUTES Herkimer County Legislature Fourth Quarter – First Day Wednesday, October 7, 2015 2:00 p.m.

The Fourth Quarterly Session of the Herkimer County Legislature was called to order by Chairman Vincent Bono at 2:00 p. m.

Chairman Bono called on Garry Murphy, Director of Probation, to lead the Legislature in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Bono called for a moment of silence in recognition of all veterans, past and present.

Roll Call: Quorum present, the following answering the roll:

Pursuant to Rule 8 of the Rules of the County Legislature, Chairman Bono asked if there were any objections or corrections to the minutes of September 16, 2015. There were none, and the Chairman ordered them approved.

Chairman Bono dispensed with the regular session to allow for the presentation of a proclamation. Chairman Bono called on Raymond Smith, Chairman of the Committee on Human Resources to present the proclamation. Mr. Smith read the proclamation which proclaimed the month of October as "Domestic Violence Awareness Month". He presented the proclamation to Jackie Ward, Director of the Domestic Violence Program of Catholic Charities. Mrs. Ward expressed appreciation for the recognition and the support from the County for the Program. She gave statistics on the services they provide for victims of domestic violence in Herkimer County.

Chairman Bono then called on Maureen Petrie from the Herkimer County Prevention Council of Catholic Charities. Ms. Petrie spoke on the growing heroin problem in Herkimer County. She stated there are now 1.5 million chronic heroin users in the United States and they are not confined to any income level or demographic, adding that the increase is markedly seen in white males 18 to 25 and the number of women heroin users has doubled since 2006. She stated that prescription drugs have become the gateway drug to heroin. Recent CDC statistics state that fatal overdoses have become the leading cause of accidental death over traffic fatalities and gun homicides in this country. She stated that in the past 6 months in Herkimer County

there has been an increase in drug arrests associated with heroin, and admissions to treatment for heroin have more than doubled since 2013 in Herkimer County. Most importantly she stated that young people have been lost in Herkimer County due to heroin overdose. She discussed the Community Partnership Coalition of Herkimer County which consists of the Office of Mental Health, Sheriff's Department, local law enforcement and school personnel and others who have dedicated their time to addressing this problem. This Partnership Coalition has trained 60 people to administer the drug Narcan that can reverse the effects of a heroin or opiate overdose, and has also provided community awareness and education through social media and they have just obtained a grant. She concluded by saying that more has to be done in the education, awareness and treatment without stigma of this growing problem.

Pursuant to Rule 11, Chairman Bono opened the floor for public comment. There were no appearances.
