Herkimer County Legislature First Quarter – Second Day Wednesday, January 23, 2013 7:30 p.m.

- 3. Catholic Charities of Herkimer County, 61 West Street, Ilion, NY 13357, in the amount of \$20,000 to screen and provide assessment of clients who may have domestic violence issues as a barrier to self-sufficiency or receipt of child support;
- 4. Legal Aid Society of Mid-New York, 255 Genesee Street, Utica, NY 13501, to assist TANF and Safety Net clients in the appeal process, who have been denied Social Security Disability or Supplemental Security Income benefits, with said contract not to exceed \$12,000;

Resource Center for Independent Living, Inc., 409 Columbia St., PO Box 210, Utica, NY 13503, to work with clients who have medical exemptions, or limited exemptions, to bridge the gap between vocational services and disability support services to achieve employment, with said contract not to exceed \$45,000.
- 7. Center for Family Life and Recovery (formerly Family Services of the Mohawk Valley), 401 Columbia St., Utica, NY 13502, to provide preventive services to the Family Support Persons in Need of Supervision Unit (PINS), with said contract not to exceed \$349,479;
- 8. Catholic Charities of Herkimer County, 61 West Street, Ilion, NY 13357, in the amount of \$38,500 to provide non-residential services to TANF clients and their families who are victims of domestic violence;

WHEREAS, this legislation, while denying the rights of law abiding citizens, fails to address the problem of acts of violence perpetrated by criminals and those who are dangerously mentally ill; and

WHEREAS, this legislation creates an environment in the state which is hostile to gun manufacture and ownership; and

WHEREAS, Remington Arms Company is a major employer in Upstate New York, and a significant manufacturing success story in recent years; and a company which the Herkimer County Legislature has been proud to support, and will continue to support; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Herkimer County Legislature does hereby oppose the enactment of the New York State Secure Ammunition and Firearms Enforcement Act of 2013 because it fundamentally alters or abridges the right to keep and bear arms without addressing the problems of gun violence; and, be it further
