MINUTES

Herkimer County Legislature Third Quarter – First Day Wednesday, July 11, 2012 2:00 p.m.

The Third Quarterly Session of the Herkimer County Legislature was called to order by Chairman Vincent Bono at 2:00 p. m.

Chairman Bono called on Jeffrey Carpenter, Assistant District Attorney, to lead the Legislature in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Bono called for a moment of silence in recognition of all veterans, past and present.

Roll Call: Quorum present, the following answering the roll:

Pursuant to Rule 8 of the Rules of the County Legislature, Chairman Bono asked if there were any objections or corrections to the minutes of June 13, 2012. Mrs. Rose made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hartman, to amend that the minutes to include that she had signed in to speak at the public comment period, but was denied based on the opinion of the County Attorney. The motion was approved by voice vote:

Chairman Bono dispensed with the regular session to allow Raymond Smith, Chairman of the Committee on Human Resources, to make a presentation. Legislator Smith called on Tim Seymour, Commissioner of Social Services, and staff from the Department of Social Services and presented each with a certificate of appreciation in recognition of their participation in the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program. The following were recognized: Andrea Mancuso, Sue Overholt, Kristin Baker, Debbie Smith, Christine Marsden, Sara Riente and Cathy Lowell, who coordinated the program. Legislator Smith expressed appreciation to these individuals for volunteering their time in this effort and Commissioner Seymour advised that for taxes 2011 the total federal refund obtained was \$918,107 and state refunds amounted to \$225,691.

Chairman Bono then called on Maureen Petrie with the Herkimer County Prevention Council and Lee Livermore with the Poison Control Center to make a presentation on synthetic drug use. Ms. Petrie discussed the newly formed Community Partnership comprised of local law enforcement, the Sheriff's Department and other organizations to address the issue of the dangers synthetic drug use. She gave a brief overview of these synthetic drugs, which are man-made chemicals that mimic other substances and referred to the synthetic cannabinoids, which can be 3 to 800 times more potent than marijuana, and synthetic cathinone, which is referred to as "bath salts", which mimic the chemicals found in cocaine or methamphetamines. She discussed the dangers of these drugs and that there are no studies done on the long term effects. She introduced Lee Livermore of the Upstate Poison Control Center to provide more information. Mr. Livermore presented supporting statistics and healthcare costs because of the use of these synthetic drugs. He stated that so far in 2012 they have seen more than 100% increase in "bath salts" cases coming from Herkimer County. He stated that the Poison Control Center is encouraging every level of government, law enforcement and healthcare to help remove this poison from the streets.
