Herkimer County Legislature Third Quarterly Session Wednesday, July 7, 2010 2:00 p.m.

This Session of the Herkimer County Legislature was called to order by Chairman Raymond Smith at 2:00 p.m.

WHEREAS, by letter dated July 1, 2010, James W. Wallace, Jr., County Administrator, advises that a proposal has been adopted by the Committees below to authorize payment of \$400,000 to the Village of Herkimer for improvements to its sewer system/wastewater treatment plant, and for additional payments of \$20,000 per year for twenty years for the same purpose; and

WHEREAS, this proposal is being made in connection with the construction of a new County Correctional Facility within the Village limits which will involve connection of the correctional facility to the Village's wastewater collection and treatment system, and may involve additional improvements, studies, upgrades or repairs to the Village's wastewater collection system (including sewers) and the wastewater treatment plant; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County of Herkimer is hereby authorized to pay the Village of Herkimer \$400,000 toward the cost of improvements to the village of Herkimer's sewer system/wastewater treatment plant and the payment of \$20,000 per year for twenty years thereafter, with those payments being contingent on the following:

- 1. The Village shall be responsible for any and all studies, improvements, upgrades or repairs to the Village's wastewater treatment collection system (including sewers) and the wastewater treatment plant made necessary by the connection of a new County Correctional Facility to that system.

- 3. Payment shall be contingent upon the issuance of all necessary permits and the construction of a new County Correctional Facility and the completion by the Village of all necessary improvements to its wastewater collection system and wastewater treatment plant made necessary by that connection. If the presently contemplated new County Correctional Facility is not constructed at the former P & C site on Route 28 in the Village of Herkimer, no such payments shall be made.
- 4. Such payments shall also be contingent upon the timely issuance of all necessary village permits for the above described project.
- 5. This offer is also contingent upon the Village accepting the same within thirty days.
