Herkimer County Community Development Block Grant Application

Herkimer County will hold a public hearing on May 14, 2025 at 6:25 p.m., in the Legislature Chambers, 109 Mary Street, Herkimer, NY, for the purpose of hearing public comments on the County's community development needs, and to discuss the possible submission of one or more Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) applications for the 2024 CDBG funding program year.

The CDBG program is administered by the New York State Office of Community Renewal (OCR), and will make available to eligible local governments approximately \$15 million for the 2024 program year for housing, economic development, public facilities, public infrastructure, and planning activities, with the principal purpose of benefitting low-to moderate-income persons. Herkimer County, upon approval of the County Legislature, intends to submit an application for up to \$225,000 in funding under the CDBG BUSINESS EXPANSION AND STARTUP (BEST) program to assist Turbo Machined Products LLC. The hearing will provide further information about the CDBG program and will allow for citizen participation in the development of any proposed grant applications and/or to provide technical assistance to develop alternate proposals. Comments on the CDBG program or proposed project(s) will be received at this time. The hearing is being conducted pursuant to Section 570.486, Subpart I of the CFR and in compliance with the requirements of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.
