

Sponsored by: Committee on Human Resources Committee on Ways and Means

WHEREAS, your Committees have been informed by letter dated June 23, 2017 from Timothy Seymour, Commissioner of Social Services, that a proposed memorandum of understanding has been submitted to and accepted for the Herkimer County Office for the Aging to provide services to the Herkimer County Department of Social Services under the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) for applicants 60 years and older for the 2017-2018 season; and

WHEREAS, the Herkimer County Department of Social Services agrees to pay the Herkimer County Office for the Aging 25% of the Department of Social Services HEAP administrative allocation for the Home Energy Assistance Program for the 2017-2018 season; and

WHEREAS, the Home Energy Assistance Program is 100% federally funded and there are sufficient monies budgeted for said services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this Legislature hereby authorizes a Memorandum of Understanding between the Herkimer County Department of Social Services and the Herkimer County Office for the Aging which will provide for the Office for the Aging to provide services for the Home Energy Assistance Program for applicants 60 years and older and the Herkimer County Department of Social Services will pay the Office for the Aging 25% of the Department of Social Services HEAP administrative funds for said services; and, be it further

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 170 adopted on July 27, 2016, authorized the Chairman of the Legislature to approve the submission of a plan to the New York State Office of Children and Family Services, and execute a contract with Kids Oneida, Inc. for the provision of detention diversion services through the Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP); and

WHEREAS, the 2017-2018 enacted State budget has re-appropriated funding for the seventh consecutive year to support the Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP), the purpose of funding is to support detention/residential placement diversion, and incorporates reliance on least restrictive options consistent with public safety, while also meeting the needs of youth within the juvenile justice system; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated July 12, 2017 Timothy Seymour, Commissioner of Social Services, has requested authorization to submit a plan to the Office of Children and Family Services to obtain funding in the amount of \$79,620, with 62% state reimbursement, for the STSJP service year October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018 and to renew the contract with Kids Oneida, Inc. to provide detention diversion services for the new period; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of this Legislature is hereby authorized to review and approve the plan for submission seeking funding for the 2017-2018 Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program STSJP plan with the NYS Office of Children and Family Services covering the period of performance from October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018; and, be it further

WHEREAS, the Herkimer County Legislature has approved and authorized bonding for the construction of a new Herkimer County Correctional Facility on a parcel of land located on the New York State Route 28 in the Village of Herkimer at the former P & C site in and for the County of Herkimer, New York, including land acquisition and site improvement pursuant to Resolution No. 41 passed on February 10, 2011; and

WHEREAS, acquisition of land is necessary to accomplish this project from the property owner, RAG Herkimer, Limited Liability Company, either by purchase or by proceedings under the Eminent Domain Procedure Law (EDPL); and

WHEREAS, the parcels to be acquired are located in the Village of Herkimer and Town of Herkimer, having tax map parcel numbers 113.65-2-5 and 113.65-2-6 in said village and number 113.3-1-11 in said town, consisting in all of approximately 26.9 acres; and

WHEREAS, as required by the statutes of the State of New York, the County of Herkimer, as condemnor, must comply with the provisions of Article 2 of the Eminent Domain Procedure Law; and

WHEREAS, following the preparation of Full Environmental Assessment Form analyzing the potential impacts of the new Correctional Facility at the former P&C Site, the Herkimer County Legislature classified the construction of the new Correctional Facility as a Type I action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), Article 8 of the New York State Conservation Law and Part 617 of Title 6, Codes Rules and Regulations (6 NYCRR), and, following a Lead Agency dispute with the Village of Herkimer that was resolved by the Commissioner of the Department of Environmental Conservation confirming the authority of the County of Herkimer to serve as the Lead Agency under SEQRA, by Resolution No. 40, dated January 26, 2011, the Herkimer County Legislature determined that the construction of the proposed Correctional Facility at the former P&C Site will not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts and issued a Negative Declaration for the project at that location; and

WHEREAS, there have been no significant changes to the proposed project, the former P&C Site or environmental regulations applicable to the proposed project that would warrant reconsideration of the Negative Declaration adopted in January 2011; and

WHEREAS, an updated appraisal as to the value of said land has been completed by Paul K. Hatzinger Associates which appraised the real property in the amount of \$584,000, less the cost of environmental remediation and pavement and concrete removal; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that an offer be made in an approved amount to the owner of said parcel of property in attempting to negotiate the acquisition of the parcel by purchase; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of this Legislature be and hereby is authorized and empowered to offer the sum of \$584,000, less the cost of environmental remediation and pavement and concrete removal for purchase of the premises and to negotiate with the owner on behalf of the County of Herkimer for the purchase of the parcel of land necessary; and, it is further

RESOLVED, that in the event that is found to be impossible to acquire said property by purchase, the County Attorney is authorized and empowered to commence a proceeding under and pursuant to the Eminent Domain Procedure Law to acquire the property set forth and described above.



RESOLUTION OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF HERKIMER, EXTENDING THE RATE OF TAXES ON SALES AND USES OF TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY AND OF CERTAIN SERVICES, AND ON OCCUPANCY OF HOTEL ROOMS AND AMUSEMENT CHARGES, PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 29 OF THE TAX LAW OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the County of Herkimer as follows:

SECTION 1. The first sentence of section two of Resolution No. 344 as enacted in nineteen hundred eighty-seven, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Imposition of sales tax.

On or after March 1, 1988, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid a tax of three percent upon, and for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid an <u>additional</u> tax of one percent upon:

SECTION 2. Subdivision (f) of section three of Resolution No. 344 as enacted in nineteen hundred eighty-seven, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

- (f) With respect to the <u>additional</u> tax of one percent imposed for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, the provision of subdivisions (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) of this section apply, except that for the purposes of this subdivision, all references in said subdivisions (a), (b), (c) and (d) to an effective date shall be read as referring to September 1, 1994, all references in said subdivision (a) to the date four months prior to the effective date shall be read as referring to May 1, 1994, and the reference in subdivision (b) to the date immediately preceding the effective date shall be read as referring to August 31, 1994. Nothing herein shall be deemed to exempt from tax at the rate in effect prior to September 1, 1994, any transaction which may not be subject to the additional tax imposed effective on that date.
- SECTION 3. Section four of Resolution No. 344 as enacted in nineteen hundred eighty-seven, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4. Imposition of compensating use tax.

(a) Except to the extent that property or services have already been or will be subject to the sales tax under this enactment, there is hereby imposed on every person a use tax for the use within this taxing jurisdiction on and after September 1, 1994, except as otherwise exempted under this enactment, (A) of any tangible personal property purchased at retail, (B) of any tangible personal property (other than computer software used by the author or other creator) manufactured, processed or assembled by the user (i) if items of the same kind of tangible personal property are offered for sale by him in the regular course of business or (ii) if the items are used as such or incorporated into a structure, building or real property, by a contractor, subcontractor or repairman in erecting structures or buildings, or building on, or otherwise adding to, altering, improving, maintaining, servicing or repairing real property, property or land, as the

terms real property, property or land are defined in the real property tax law, if items of the same kind are not offered for sale as such by such contractor, subcontractor or repairman or other user in the regular course of business, (C) of any of the services described in paragraphs (1), (7), and (8) of subdivision (c) of section two, (D) of any tangible personal property, however acquired, where not acquired for purposes of resale, upon which any of the services described under paragraphs (2), (3) and (7) of subdivision (c) of section two have been performed, (E) of any telephone answering service described in subdivision (b) of section two and (F) of any computer software written or otherwise created by the user if the user offers software of a similar kind for sale as such or as a component part of other property in the regular course of business.

- (b) For the purposes of clause (A) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the consideration given or contracted to be given for such property, or for the use of such property, including any charges for shipping or delivery as described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one, but excluding any credit for tangible personal property accepted in part payment and intended for resale.
- (c) For purposes of subclause (i) of Clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the price at which items of the same kind of tangible personal property are offered for sale by the user, and the mere storage, keeping, retention or withdrawal from storage of tangible personal property by the person who manufactured, processed or assembled such property shall not be deemed a taxable use by him.
- (d) For purposes of subclause (ii) of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the consideration given or contracted to be given for the tangible personal property manufactured, processed or assembled into the tangible personal property the use of which is subject to tax, including any charges for shipping or delivery as described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one.
- (e) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, for the purposes of clause (B) of subdivision (a) of this section, there shall be no tax on any portion of such price which represents the value added by the user to tangible personal property which he fabricates and installs to the specifications of an addition or capital improvement to real property, property or land, as the terms real property, property or land are defined in the real property tax law, over and above the prevailing normal purchase price prior to such fabrication of such tangible personal property which a manufacturer, producer or assembler would charge an unrelated contractor who similarly fabricated and installed such tangible personal property to the specifications of any addition or capital improvement to such real property, property or land.
- (f) For the purposes of clauses (C), (D) and (E) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the consideration given, or contracted to be given for the service, including the consideration for any tangible personal property transferred in conjunction with the performance of the service and also including any charges for shipping and delivery of the property so transferred and of the tangible personal property upon which the service was performed as such charges are described in paragraph three of subdivision (b) of section one.

(g) For the purposes of clause (F) of subdivision (a) of this section, for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of four percent, and on and after December 1, 2020, the tax shall be at the rate of three percent, of the consideration given or contracted to be given for the tangible personal property which constitutes the blank medium, such as disks or tapes, used in conjunction with software, or for the use of such property, and the mere storage, keeping, retention or withdrawal from storage of computer software described in such clause (F) by its author or other creator shall not be deemed a taxable use by such person.

SECTION 4. Section 4-A of Resolution No. 344 as enacted in nineteen hundred eighty-seven, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4-A. Imposition of additional rate of sales and compensating use taxes.

Pursuant to the authority of section 1210-E of the Tax Law, in addition to the sales and compensating use taxes imposed by sections 2 and 4 of this resolution, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid an additional one-quarter of one percent rate of such sales and compensating use taxes, for the period beginning December 1, 2007, and ending November 30, 2020. Such additional taxes shall be identical to the taxes imposed by such sections 2 and 4 and shall be administered and collected in the same manner as such taxes. All of the provisions of this resolution relating or applicable to the administration and collection of the taxes imposed by such sections 2 and 4 shall apply to the additional taxes imposed by this section, including the applicable transitional provisions, limitations, special provisions, exemptions, exclusions, refunds and credits as are set forth in this resolution, with the same force and effect as if those provisions had been incorporated in full into this section and had expressly referred to the additional taxes imposed by this section.

SECTION 5. Subdivision (k) of section six of Resolution No. 344 as enacted in nineteen hundred eighty-seven, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

(k) Exemption of certain energy sources and related services from additional one percent rate of tax. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of this resolution, receipts from the retail sale or use of fuel oil and coal used for residential purposes; the receipts from the retail sale or use of wood used for residential heating purposes; and the receipts from every sale, other than for resale, or use of propane (except when sold in containers of less than one hundred pounds), natural gas, electricity, steam and gas, electric and steam services used for residential purposes shall be exempt from the <u>additional</u> one percent rate of sales and compensating use taxes imposed by sections 2 and 4, respectively, of this resolution for the period commencing September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020.

SECTION 6. Paragraphs (B) and (C) of subdivision one of section eleven of Resolution No. 344 as enacted in nineteen hundred eighty-seven, as amended, are amended to read as follows:

- (B) With respect to the additional tax of one percent imposed for the period beginning September 1, 1994, and ending November 30, 2020, in respect to the use of property used by the purchaser in this County prior to September 1, 1994.
- (C) With respect to the additional tax of one-quarter of one percent imposed for the period beginning December 1, 2007, and ending November 30, 2020, in respect to the use of property used by the purchaser in this County prior to December 1, 2007.

SECTION 7. Subdivisions (d) and (f) of section 14 of Resolution No. 344 of nineteen eighty-seven, as amended, are amended to read as follows:

SECTION 7. Subdivisions (d) and (f) of section 14 of Resolution No. 344 of nineteen eighty-seven, as amended, are amended to read as follows:

- (d) During the period commencing June 1, 2006, and ending November 30, 2020, net collections from the additional one percent rate of tax shall be retained for county purposes.
- (f) Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law, with respect to the additional one-quarter of one percent rate of sales and compensating use taxes imposed pursuant to the authority of section twelve hundred ten-E of the New York Tax Law for the period beginning December 1, 2007, and ending November 30, 2020, the county shall use all net collections from such additional one-quarter of one percent rate to pay the county's expenses for the construction of additional correctional facilities. Such net collections shall be deposited in a special fund to be created by the county separate and apart from any other funds and accounts of the county. Any and all remaining net collections from such additional tax, after the expenses of such construction are paid, shall be deposited by the county in the general fund of the county for any county purpose.

SECTION 8. This enactment shall take effect December 1, 2017.
